OREGON VOTER BILL OF RIGHTS

You have many voting rights under Oregon law. These include **the right to** ...

... vote if you are a US citizen, live in Oregon, are 18 years old, and have registered.

... vote if you are homeless.

... vote even if you have a guardian and even if you need help reading or filling out your ballot.

... use a signature stamp or other mark.

... ask for help from elections staff or from a friend or family member. There are some people who cannot help you vote, for example, your boss or a union officer from your job.

... a secret vote. You do not have to tell anyone how you voted.

... use a voting system for all Federal Elections that makes it equally possible for people with disabilities to vote privately and independently.

... **file a complaint** if you think your voting rights have been denied.

THE HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT (HAVA) OF 2002

The Help America Vote Act (HAVA) requires voting systems to be accessible for voters with disabilities in a manner that provides the same opportunity for access, participation, privacy, and independence as other voters.

Registering to vote




Completing signature stamp attestation forms
