
## Tri-County Overdose Data Brief

Summer 2022










In 2021, nearly half of the state's overdose deaths occurred among tri-county residents. Drug overdose deaths increased 24%; fentanyl 101%.

People age 35-39 had the highest death rate from fentanyl at 19 per 100,000.



People ages 50-54 have the highest death rate from drug overdoses involving all drugs
