HOME – ARP Purpose

- \$5 billion through the HOME Investment Partnerships Program
 - Increase affordable housing to address homelessness
- Washington County Consortium

 – Including the cities of Beaverton and Hillsboro
 - \$6,101,728
 - 15% Administration
- HOME ARP funds must be used to primarily benefit individuals and families that meet the requirements for one or more "qualifying populations" (QPs)



HOME – ARP Qualifying Populations (QPs)

- Homeless (McKinney Act definition at 24 CFR 91.5)
- At-risk of homelessness (McKinney Act definition at 24 CFR 91.5)
- Fleeing/Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking
 - Definitions from VAWA regulation at 24 CFR 5.2003, except
 - Human trafficking definition from Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000
- Other Populations where assistance would:
 - Prevent the family's homelessness; or
 - Serve those with the Greatest Risk of Housing Instability

Veterans and families including veteran member that meet one of preceding criteria

Eligible Activities

- Participating Jurisdictions (PJs) may use HOME ARP funds for the following eligible activities:
 - Affordable Rental Housing (HOME ARP Rental Housing)
 - Tenant Based Rental Assistance (HOME ARP TBRA)
 - Supportive Services (HOME ARP Supportive Services)
 - Non-congregate Shelter (HOME ARP NCS)
