

5,000 permanent supportive housing placements




Mostly Population A


10,000 households served with rent assistance and services to avoid homelessness

Mostly Population B


Building a Regional System of Care

Initial estimate in 2020




Carryover commitments

Capital funding for:

- 3 permanent shelters
- 4 access centers
- 100-150 recovery, transitional housing units

One-time funding for:

- Capacity building for 25 organizations
- Eviction prevention funding for 3 years (1500+ households/year)





Stakeholder advisory table discussions



Potential changes discussed:

- Add affordable housing as eligible use
- Dedicate some funds for affordable housing development
- Reduce tax rate and index tax rate
- Change distribution formula to Counties
- Expand Metro's role in oversight
- Extend or eliminate sunset





Guiding Principles for Washington County



- Keep focus on SHS goals to end chronic homeless and ensure no increase in overall homelessness.
- Continue role of local expertise to invest funds. Includes local control to streamline accountability.
- Ensure flexibility to adjust system over time. Our homeless systems of care is still being built and community needs will evolve as these investments have impact.
- No change to flow of funds or funding allocation. Must ensure reliability of payment for service contracts, and ability to continue funding system that has already been built.





Timeline Summary



To Date:

January – Metro directed staff to consider new funding for affordable housing


March - May – Stakeholder table process, focus became reallocation of SHS funds

June 11th – Metro Council received an <u>update from staff</u>

Looking ahead:

July 9th – Metro staff will present recommendations to Metro Council July 25th – Potential Metro Council public hearing August 1st – Potential Metro Council vote
