Ordinance Purpose and Summary

Ordinance No. 767 amends the Washington County 2020 Transportation Plan (TSP) relating to project development. The ordinance incorporates the Basalt Creek Transportation Refinement Plan into the TSP, and adjusts the lane numbers designation on SW Scholls Ferry Road between SW Loon Drive and approximately 1,000 feet west of SW Roy Rogers Road. The ordinance limits transportation changes to roadways within the Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) as it existed before Metro's decision to expand the UGB in October 2011 through Metro Ordinance 11-1264B.

Who Is Affected

Residents, businesses and property owners in the vicinity of the Basalt Creek Transportation Refinement Plan, and along SW Scholls Ferry Road between SW Loon Drive and approximately 1,000 feet west of SW Roy Rogers Road.

What Land is Affected

Property in the vicinity of the Basalt Creek Transportation Refinement Plan area, and along SW Scholls Ferry Road between SW Loon Drive and approximately 1,000 feet west of Roy Rogers Road.

Key Provisions

- Adds proposed road extensions to maps in TSP Policy 10 Functional Classification, TSP Policy 11 Road Jurisdiction, and TSP Policy 16 Freight.
- Adds a new study area to TSP Policy 10 to address a proposed SW Day Road Overcrossing within areas designated as Urban Reserve as part of the future concept planning in the area.
- Modifies the lane number designation for SW Scholls Ferry Road between SW Loon Drive and approximately 1,000 feet west of SW Roy Rogers Road.

SUMMARY:

Ordinance No. 767 proposes to amend the Washington County Transportation System Plan (TSP) relating to project development. The ordinance incorporates the Basalt Creek Transportation Refinement Plan into the TSP and adjusts the lane number designation on SW Scholls Ferry Road between SW Loon Drive and approximately 1,000 feet west of SW Roy Rogers Road. On June 19, 2013 the Planning Commission (PC) conducted a public hearing for this ordinance and unanimously recommended that the Board adopt Ordinance No. 767.

The Board of County Commissioners of Washington County, Oregon, recognizes that the Transportation Plan Element of the Comprehensive Plan (Volume XV) was adopted on 10 October 25, 1988, by way of Ordinance Nos. 332 and 333, and subsequently amended by Ordinance 11 Nos. 343, 382, 409, 419, 426, 432, 450, 463, 470, 471, 473, 474, 480, 483-485, 493, 494, 503, 515, 12 13 526, 537, 542, 546, 552, 556, 588, 601, 609, 611, 626, 627, 631, 642, 649, 663, 674, 683, 712, 713, 14 717, 718, 730, 739, 744, 749, and 750. 15 B. Further planning efforts of Washington County indicate there is a need for 16 amendments to the county's Transportation Plan to facilitate projects that are scheduled for near-17 term improvements. The Board takes note that such changes are for the health, welfare, and benefit

- of the residents of Washington County, Oregon.
- C. Under the provisions of Washington County Charter Chapter X, the Department of Land Use and Transportation has carried out its responsibilities, including preparation of notices, and the County Planning Commission has conducted one or more public hearings on the proposed amendments and has submitted its recommendations to the Board. The Board finds that this

3	D. The Board finds and takes public notice that it is in receipt of all matters and			
4	information necessary to consider this Ordinance in an adequate manner, and finds that this			
5	Ordinance complies with the Statewide Planning Goals, the standards for legislative plan adoption			
6	as set forth in Chapters 197 and 215 of the Oregon Revised Statutes, the Washington County			
7	Charter, the Washington County Community Development Code, and the Washington County			
8	Comprehensive Plan.




Figure 5 – Washington County Lane Numbers map, is amended as follows:






Figure 10 – Washington County Countywide Road System map, is amended as follows:

Add text describing a Day Road Overcrossing Study Area to the list of study areas in the Functional Classification Policy section of the Washington County Transportation Plan, as follows:

Day Road Overcrossing Study Area

The Basalt Creek Transportation Refinement Plan identified a need for a future Arterial corridor extending from the intersection of Boones Ferry Road and Day Road over Interstate 5 and connecting to Elligsen Road. The proposed Arterial is not intended to provide access to or from Interstate 5. This study area is intended to identify the area where this alignment shall be evaluated prior to development or redevelopment occurring. The ultimate alignment will be determined through concept planning after the study area has been designated within the Urban Growth Boundary.




Figure 5 – Washington County Lane Numbers map, is amended as follows:
