## **REQUESTED ACTION:**

Adopt the Washington County Native Tree List associated with A-Engrossed Ordinance No. 902 and authorize the Chair to sign the Resolution and Order memorializing the action.

## **SUMMARY:**

A-Engrossed Ordinance No. 902 amends the Community Development Code, related to regulating development in areas designated as Significant Natural Resources (SNR). A-Engrossed Ordinance No. 902 is posted on the County's land use ordinance webpage at the following link:

A-Engrossed Ordinance No. 902 references a Washington County Native Tree List. This list includes Category A (Native Trees) and Category B (Native Understory Trees and Shrubs). The list will be used to support implementation of revised Community Development Code Sections 422-9 and 422-10 as proposed in A-Engrossed Ordinance No. 902.
