Forest Grove School District is a public school district in Washington County, Oregon, United States. It serves the communities of Cornelius, Dilley, Forest Grove and Gales Creek. Approximately 60% of high school students qualify for free/reduced lunch. 1 in 5 Oregon students live in poverty. Poverty creates additional needs for children such as mental health, clothing needs, and even shelter.

Even with the other half of high school students not being eligible for the reduced lunch program, these families often make just enough to cover basic living expenses. This community cupboard will be available to all students to ease any worries about food insecurity. We are asking the community to partner with us to ensure that there is always enough food to go around, and our students feel comfortable and supported using this resource.

Food

Canned meat & fish, nuts, cereal, pancake mix, instant oatmeal, box rice and pasta mixes, pasta, nut butters, canned beans, chilis and soups, canned vegetables and fruit, shelf stable milks and milk alternatives, instant potatoes, sugar, coffee, juice, mayo, jelly snack items for children like crackers, granola bars, fruit snacks

Cleaning Supplies

Disinfectant wipes, Windex, sponge mop, Swiffer Floor Cleaning Cloths, Soft Scrub cleaner, automatic dish soap, liquid dish soap, liquid laundry detergent, large garbage bags, tall kitchen bags (13gal)

Hygiene
