## **ADDITIONAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

### Community Mental Health Provider Presentation

The PHAC had previously expressed an interest in learning more about work being done by other partners within the community. This month, the group will have an opportunity to hear from Kristin Griffey. Kristen describes herself as dedicated to healing hearts, transforming lives, and creating resilient communities. As a coach, trauma specialist and resilience consultant, she empowers individuals and organizations to navigate the complexities of trauma with compassion and strength. She blends traditional wisdom of healers with modern practices to guide others towards wholeness.

Kristen's presentation *The Truth About Trauma: A Washington County Story of Survival* unravels one person's story from trauma to PTSD, to Post-Traumatic Growth, making the case for why trauma competency must be rooted into our communities to heal and thrive.

### Modernization Strategies Conversation

In September 2022, the group received an overview and update of Public Health Modernization within Oregon and Washington County. Since then, the group has had several presentations current work and priorities Washington County Public Health has been focused on related to modernizing our local public health system including a large-scale community engagement process (February 2023) and climate action plan development (March 2023). Last month, the group also had a discussion related to the foundational capabilities outline in the State's Public Health Modernization Manual and what it would look like for those capabilities to be implemented across all programs within the division. This conversation served as a starting point for our internal planning related to our Modernization Implementation Plan (MIP) which will be due to OHA in 2025.

This month, as follow up to our last group discussion, we will be presenting the group with a high-level overview of our planning process for this biennium including reviewing with the group what strategies we'll be focused on to ensure that we're meeting the requirements outlined by the state for the foundational capabilities.
